
#### THE ANNUAL HOLIDAY SHOW

The 2002 Holiday Show: SANTAPLICITY !

The 2002 Holiday Show "SANTAPLICITY!" was a great success, playing to a full house in Mystic. Bill presented checks for \$500, to Rev Ken Carpenter on behalf of the MASH shelter, and to Beth Ann Stewart, Director of Stonington Human Services. In addition, checks were mailed out on Christmas day to 12 regional social service agencies.

Joining Bill, Kay, and Scott for this event was original Ensemble member Dave Coxe, who came in from Ohio to be part of the festivities.

In addition to Dave, there were four other members of the cast and crew who had also been involved in the very first LUNCH event back in 1991., as well as a large number of first-time participants.

In addition to having Dave there, this also marked the last holiday Show appearance for our two high school seniors, Jackie Schwenk and Chris Kauffmann, both of whom have been with the Ensemble since their middle school days.

Our goals as always are: (1) To raise money for fighting hunger and poverty in our region (2) To show kids that they can make a difference in the lives of others; (3) To provide a fun-filled family entertainment event

## **VERY IMPORTANT !** **PLEASE HELP US MEET** **THE FEINSTEIN CHALLENGE !**

The Feinstein Foundation of Providence RI is offering a challenge to organizations like LUNCH which help fight hunger and poverty. For all donations that we receive between March 1 and April 30 of this year, the Feinstein Foundation will add a proportional share of a 1 million dollar pool that it has designated for this purpose.

This means, for example that if all participating organizations raise a combined total of \$200,000, and we raise \$10,000 of that, that would be 5% of the total, so we would receive 5% of the 1 million dollars, or \$50,000. We will receive a percentage of the million dollar pool that is proportional to the amount we raise, compared to the total raised by all participating organizations.

What this means to you is that your donation made between now and April 30 is going to be made larger -- we don't know exactly how much, but the more we raise, the larger our share of the million dollar pie will be. Every dollar is important.


This is the best opportunity we have ever had to be able to significantly increase our level of contributions, and it matters now more than ever.

With the economy as it is, the closing of some state social service offices, and all the state layoffs in social services, the impact on children and on families in need of aid has been severe. Many agencies are having a difficult time finding beds for the homeless and food for those in need.

Here is an opportunity to make your donations reach a little farther. Please help us rise to this challenge and claim a good slice of the Feinstein challenge funds.

If you usually make a donation to us in the Fall, consider making it now instead, so that we can raise the largest possible amount before the end of April. Our teamwork will help make a difference in the lives of those who need a hand to help steady their course..


